Council Priority Update

The specific priority identified by the Council as it relates to ARPA funding is "Develop Metrics to Determine Priorities".

The following metrics have been suggested to date:

- Leverage additional funding sources;
- Support established Council goals/priorities;
- Impact on number of residents;
- Mitigate future cost to taxpayers;
- One-time costs vs on-going costs

As part of the outreach process, we received comments as it relates to the process by which funding would be allocated and how to determine priorities. The suggestions included:

- Consider allocating funds to projects where no other funding source is available.
- Consider allocating funds to each area to ensure that all priority areas realize a benefit.
- Ask the experts
- Funding was allocated to assist cities in their recovery, should we ascertain what was most affected by COVID.
- There is a rush to use the funds to fix problems that were prevalent before the pandemic or should the funds be used for new things.
- Think about complex problems what is the state or federal government not doing that impacts our community.
- Quantify non out of pocket costs that could be redirected.
- Allowed use of the funding is pretty-wide ranging, but it could be paralyzing.
- What is the City's role in addressing identified issues, versus support of organization working on the issue?

Other Initiatives

Opioid Settlement Funds – Staff has made contact with the Attorney General's office to ascertain the status of the settlement. All paperwork has been submitted to the Courts by the State of Maine. We are awaiting information as to how much and when the funding will become available to parties of the suit.

State of Maine Emergency Housing Funding – Staff discusses housing opportunities biweekly with the Governor's Senior Advisor on Housing Policy and Maine State Housing Authority (MSHA). To date, it appears that the project within Bangor that would be the best fit for these funds is the Pine Tree Inn transitional housing project. As the State funding does not carry the same federal requirements, this will allow the project to come online sooner. Discussions continue as to the potential use of funds to encourage housing to those unsheltered individuals with housing vouchers.

Penobscot County – Both the beneficiary and sub recipient application processes have closed. In the beneficiary category (grants capped at \$25,000), there were approximately 30 applications. The sub recipient category received approximately 17 applications. All applications are currently under review and are expected to be considered by the County Commissioners in August, with final recommendations in September. City and County staff continue to discuss the timing and opportunity to partner on initiatives.

Summary of Feedback Received

Attached is a summary of the feedback received to date as well as a listing of the comments and feedback received from the various outreach methods.

City Councilor Suggestions

To date, the City Council has waited for the results of the public feedback sessions before sharing their thoughts and priorities. As a starting point, staff will review the Town Hall presentation and then the balance of the time is set aside for City Councilors to discuss suggestions, priorities, request additional information etc.
