**Executive Summary:** This Resolve will accept and appropriate an Airport Improvement Grant under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) program in the amount of \$31,605 from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and \$831 from Maine Department of Transportation (MDOT) for the Runway Rehab Precision Approach Path Indicators (PAPI) at the Bangor International Airport.

This grant requires a local match in the amount of \$832. These funds were approved during the FY26 budget process as part of the Airport's capital requests.

**Executive Summary:** This Resolve will accept and appropriate an Airport Improvement Program Grant in the Amount of \$4,275,136 from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and \$112,503 from Maine Department of Transportation (MDOT) for the last 1,058 feet of runway reconstruction at Bangor International Airport.

This grant requires a local match in the amount of \$112,504. These funds were budgeted and approved during the FY26 budget process. This item was reviewed and recommended for passage at the Finance Committee on July 21, 2025.

**Executive Summary:** This Order would authorize the award of \$550,200 in Opioid Settlement Funds to Bangor Public Health & Community Services for the creation of an "Intensive Case Manager" program for individuals with HIV.

Penobscot County is currently experiencing an HIV outbreak with cases concentrated within the City of Bangor. Since early 2024, there have been 27 confirmed HIV diagnoses among people who have identified as

Penobscot County is currently experiencing an HIV outbreak with cases concentrated within the City of Bangor. Since early 2024, there have been 27 confirmed HIV diagnoses among people who have identified as being un-housed, with a history of substance use, and most also diagnosed with Hepatitis. Recently, the sole provider of intensive case management services to individuals who have been diagnosed with HIV in this region, discontinued providing services.

The Opioid Settlement Funds Advisory Committee identified the need for intensive case management services as a critical gap in providing care to this population and in preventing additional spread of the disease. This funding would create an intensive case management program within BP&CS with a goal of:

- Reducing the mortality and morbidity of HIV among people who were diagnosed as part of an outbreak in the greater Bangor area.
- Reducing the viral loads of those diagnosed through appropriate and adherent treatment support.
- Reducing the transmission of HIV and HCV by supporting individuals to achieve viral suppression.

The program is intended to become self-funding following this initial two-year investment. This item was reviewed and recommended for passage at a Council workshop meeting on July 28, 2025.
