City Grants Available

Updates from Anja Collette, Planning Officer for the City of Bangor

- \$76,000 available
 - o Part of the Climate Action Program
- Goal of the grant is to improve bicycle infrastructure
 - o Adding in bike racks downtown and schools
 - o Installing bike racks at bus shelters and the airport
 - Working on secure bicycle storage
 - o Developing bicycle rebates and EV bike rebates
 - Tiered programs based on income thresholds
- Grant due on April 30th

Co-living Dormitories

- Falls under boarding housing ordinances passed last year
- 8 or more rooms in a building (boarding houses less than 7 units)
- Allows up to 25% of the building allowed for short-term use
 - o Works for folks who are visiting or in-need of place to stay for a short period of time
- For housing supply needs: 75% needs to be full-time housing, kitchen needs to be developed, and community space available
- Questions from committee regarding affordable regarding limits on affordability to keep from driving up costs, seasonal housing, etc.

Change in parking regulations

- Changing the requirements from 1.5 spaces per unit needing to be available to 1 unit
 - o Goals to minimize sprawl from needed parking lots, run-off, and to encourage the use of public transit
- Concerns about people with mobility issues needing accessible ways to transport; does one spot limit people from disabilities and/or elderly from being able to use the housing?

- Opportunities to include Parks and Rec in being an Autism Certified City by ensuring changes are reflected in all updates
- New data and research being implemented to give clear numbers on the number of visitors to our forest/green spaces in Bangor

- City Manager will ensure that subcommittees are connected and emails/phones are shared between small groups working on specific projects

Subject: Community Development Engagement and Outreach Strategies

This is an introduction of the Community Development Division's (CDBG Program) community engagement strategy to deliver effective programs and projects. The discussion also includes the City's compliance with anti-discrimination laws and resources that are available to citizens seeking staff assistance.

Citizen Participation and the Community Development Program

In order to continue to receive federal funding, the City is required to adhere to certain rules and regulations which place heavy emphasis on community engagement. This involves the development of citizen participation processes and to enforce the protections of federal Civil Rights laws, including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 as amended, Section 109 of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975.

Several Community Development plans and strategies are being updated in the next 18 months, including the Consolidated Plan, the Fair Housing Plan, and the Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy. Both the Community Engagement process, and the compliance with anti-discrimination law, are being reviewed to ensure that the citizens of Bangor have fair and equitable access to the programs themselves as well as to information necessary for engagement with our staff.

<u>Citizen Participation Plan:</u> The department uses this Plan when carrying out activities that include planning, reporting, or providing public notice on any community development. The staff typically hold public hearings, attend committee meetings, and publish public notices in the Bangor Daily News to interact with the community. However, staff would like to use additional engagement strategies in the upcoming year to increase the level of participation by residents. In addition to community-wide consultations with non-profits and public service providers, staff will use a variety of outreach strategies to communicate with the public. These include neighborhood meetings, surveys, and workshops, as well as refreshing the information available online, through our website and social media accounts.

Staff believe that meetings which are held in a variety of locations and times of day will draw a diverse number of citizens to hear about our program and provide feedback on our work. Additionally,

the use of online resources for outreach and education may increase the engagement level from that previously seen. Staff is aiming to create opportunities for residents that do not typically interact with us by applying a social lens to the focus of CDBG funding – low to moderate income people, unhoused persons, persons with limited English proficiency or literacy, and those with a variety of physical abilities.

<u>Civil Rights Notice:</u> The City is required to comply with the non-discrimination provisions of the federal laws which protect residents from unequal treatment based on any socioeconomic characteristics, demographics, or cultural basis. A recent review of our Notices included suggestions to staff on ways to enhance the display of our notices and additional information that we could provide. These suggestions include a number of translations that can be prepared and available on our website, as well as informative links to resources, and a clear and understandable grievance process with a contact person identified as the City's Civil Rights Coordinator, which is statutorily required.

Staff is interested in implementing any or all of these suggestions by obtaining feedback from this committee, the multicultural community and other stakeholders that have thoughts on ways to increase the informative nature of the Notice itself, and of the process to receive grievances and complaints under the law.

Staff appreciate this Committee's willingness to offer input or leadership on the implementation of inclusive communication and request your thoughtful suggestions for improving our overall engagement strategies for the Community Development Programs.

Title, Ordinance

Amending Chapter 165, Land Development Code, District Map to Re-zone a Property Located on Grandview Avenue from Park & Open Space (P&O) to Multifamily & Service District (M&SD).

Summary

This Ordinance would amend the Land Development Code, District Map to re-zone the property at Map-Lot R41-023-A, located on Grandview Avenue, from Park & Open Space (P&O) to Multifamily & Service District (M&SD). The total area requested to be changed is approximately 10.5 acres. The applicant and owner of record is the City of Bangor.

The area around the property consists of primarily residential and commercial uses, as well as a park and Bangor High School to the north. The zoning in the area is M&SD and S&PS to the west, LDR to the east, and S&PS to the south. This area is within the growth boundary shown in the 2022 Comprehensive Plan and the future land use map in the Plan shows this property in the Neighborhood Residential area, which consists of "medium-density residential development with limited commercial and institutional uses that are complementary to the surrounding residential land uses".

Chapter 165 of the Code of the City of Bangor, District Map, is amended to reclassify the property at Map-Lot R41-023-A, located on Grandview Avenue, from Park & Open Space (P&O) to Multifamily & Service District (M&SD). The total area requested to be changed is approximately 10.5 acres and is shown in the attached exhibit.
